### **NEW SCHOOL UPDATE**

The concrete foundation and water/sewage lines are now completed. In February, the steel framing will be erected, ready for a roof and heating units. At present, the site plan has already been approved and the Committee of Adjustments has granted the school a life-term minor variance for the site. Currently, we are reviewing the exterior colours and going over the interior layout of the building. We will continue to provide a monthly update of the site. ### **UNDERSTANDING YOUR RECEIPT**

In general, the tax calculation is based on a calendar year (Jan - Dec), and only the portion of tuition used up is calculated. For example, a new student who started in September will only receive a receipt for September until December regardless if payment started August 1st.

For elementary, the calculation is based on the following premise. Your child is in school for approximately 6 hours a day, one hour of which is considered non-academic (outdoor time and lunch time). This time is considered child care and and therefore one-sixth of the tuition you pay is a tax credit and considered child care services. If your child is in the before/after school program, this is also considered child care.

The receipts will be distributed this week. Parents will be required to sign for it in order to ensure that everyone has received it. Should you require another receipt, a charge of \$10.00 will be levied. Any questions can be directed to Mrs. Ramirez.
